

# **TUNBRIDGE WELLS MUNGA 2019**

## **DRAFT CLIMATE CHANGE RESOLUTION**

### **The General Assembly of the United Nations**

1. Reaffirming support for the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate
2. Change (UNFCCC) adopted by the Rio Summit of 1992,
3. Recalling the Kyoto Protocol of 11<sup>th</sup> December 1997 and the Doha Amendment of
4. 21<sup>st</sup> December 2012,
5. Noting that the Paris Agreement entered into force on 4th November 2016 aimed
6. at limiting global warming to less than two degrees Celsius and at pursuing
7. efforts to limit the rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius,
8. Noting the IPCC Special Report on Global Warming of 1.5°C of 6<sup>th</sup> October 2018,
9. Recognising the especial problems of the impact of global warming on less
10. developed member states, particularly small island states,
11. Noting that to date only two member states have achieved carbon neutrality,
12. Recognising the commitment of certain member states towards achieving carbon
13. neutrality,
14. Recognising that global warming and climate change is a crisis which transcends
15. national boundaries and that any solution to this crisis will require international
16. commitment and cooperation on the part of all member states.

### **Be it hereby resolved that the General Assembly**

17. Strongly urges developed member states to commit to achieving carbon
- neutrality as soon as possible,
18. Recognises that developing member states are reliant on fossil fuels,
19. Strongly urges all member states to adopt renewable resources rather than
20. nuclear power as an alternative to the combustion of fossil fuels for electricity
21. generation,
22. Strongly urges all member states to commit to the phasing out of all coal
23. combustion power stations with immediate effect,
24. Requires all member states to immediately cease the exploitation of oilfields in
25. environmentally sensitive areas such as Alaska and Yasuni,
26. Requires all member states to immediately cease the development and use of
27. new technologies, such as 'fracking' for the extraction of fossil fuel resources,
28. Calls for the establishment of an international fund for the resettlement of climate
29. change refugees to be contributed to by all member states on the basis of carbon
30. emissions per capita,
31. Calls for the establishment of quotas for the acceptance of climate change
32. refugees by all member states on the basis on GDP
33. Calls upon all member states to take measures to ensure that all future transport,
34. both national and international, is sustainable.
